Meeting was called at 1:15. Present at Green Bank were: R. Fisher, G. Peery, J. Coe, F. Crews, R. Fleming, L. Howell, S. Smith, J. Ralston, and R. Moore. In the Ivy Road Teleconference Room at CV were: H. Hvatum, J. Marymor, and M. Balister.

Prices quoted by the five companies responding to our solicitation were again reviewed for the benefit of all concerned. B. Peery reviewed and summarized our proposed specification as compared to what the five respondents stated their equipment could fulfill. Two of the five appeared to be capable of meeting our spec -- but at a much higher price than the other three. Scientific Atlanta, E-Systems, and RSI did not meet various aspects of our spec but there was some support for the contention that one or all of these suppliers' telescopes could be adapted to our needs.

Discussion ensued concerning the possibilities and costs of the system utilizing a cassegrain instead of prime focus. It was decided that the best way to find answers to the technical and engineering questions in our mind was to visit RSI, E-Systems, and Scientific Atlanta. R.
