Dear Dr. Webber,

Recently Spain has signed the Memorandum of Understanding joining the ALMA Project. Nominated by the OCYT (Oficina de Ciencia y Tecnología) I am the representative of Spain in the ECC.

In order to motivate the interest of the scientific and industrial communities of Spain in ALMA, recently a presentation, organized by the OCYT was held in Madrid. After an introduction of the project by Mrs. Catherine Cesarsky, Mr. Karl Menten and Mr. Stephane Guilloteau, it was a fruitful debate. The number of attendants as well as the enthusiasm and motivation shown during the presentation reveal the interest that ALMA raised in my country.

During the last month, I received many questions, both from industry and scientists related on up to what degree it is possible to be involved in the working groups of ALMA. I noted clearly that any participation requires the full agreement of all the working group members and, of course, of their technical and/or scientific capabilities.
